MPLL Rules

A few rules to remind everyone as the season starts

- 1) No Outside food or beverage. Please support our concession stand, they are a primary revenue source for the league.
- 2) No Dogs or other pets.
- 3) No Tobacco or alcohol products of any kind. No Smoking or vaping.
- 4) No skateboards, bikes, scooters, hoverboards or rollerblades.
- 5) No climbing on bleachers, walls, fences, railings or dugouts.
- 6) No soft toss into any fences.
- 7) Abusive behavior and language will not be tolerated by any member, player, or spectator. Disciplinary action for abusive behavior and language will be enforced by the Board of Directors.



Reserved Parking spots

Every year, the number one complaint I receive emails about in week one of the season is people parking in a reserved spot. As part of our fundraising every year, we sell a reserved parking spot for \$400 a year. Their last name is painted on the curb for that parking spot. If you park in a spot with a last name painted on it, and your last name does not match that spot, you are parking in the wrong spot!!!!



People pay money for that right to park there and I ask everyone to respect those spots. If you are interested in obtaining a spot, they can still be purchased at the concession stand or our online store for \$400.00.

For your safety

Unfortunately, we have had vehicles broken into in the past. It is our plan to have an officer or security guard on-site during games every night of the season. This should help, but we ask that everyone be vigilant and keep your eyes and ears open in the parking lot. If you see anything suspicious, please report it immediately to the officer or to the concession stand. You can contact Park Police as well at 210-207-8590.

We ask that you also take measures to prevent any break-ins of vehicles. The National Insurance Crime Bureau presents some tips to help minimize the risk of a break-in. With these common sense habits and preventative measures, you can greatly reduce the chances your vehicle will become a target.

- 1) Lock your doors While this piece of advice should be a no-brainer, up to a quarter of vehicle thefts are from unlocked cars, according to some law enforcement agencies. Even if you're running into the store for a Coke, that's too long to leave your vehicle's contents open for the taking. Simply locking the doors will deter those who might just be waiting around for an easy target.
- 2) Keep it tidy Almost any worthless personal item that's visible from the outside -even an empty shopping bag -- could be seen as a valuable or a carrier of valuables. If you have a wagon or SUV that leaves your cargo area on display, consider getting a cover. Most of these vehicles can be fitted with inexpensive retractable covers to help keep shopping bags or other belongings out of sight.
- **3)** Conceal all the evidence Don't leave any bait out for thieves; stow your electronics and accessories well out of sight-or better yet, bring it with you. The evidence alone might be enough to pique the interest of thieves, so hide that too, including power plugs, telltale iPod adapters, or nav-system windshield suction-cup mounts, and even put the cigarette lighter back in place.
- 4) Stash before -- not after -- you park Get in the habit of putting shopping bags in the trunk right when you return to the vehicle, rather than after you park at the next place.

Volunteer Badges

Starting next week we will be asking all coaches, team moms, board members to wear their ID badges at all times. MPLL performs a background check on all volunteers. This is to protect OUR kids. This is for their safety.

Dana Sorbel handles all of our background checks. All completed checks will have a badge printed out and will be at the concession stand for pickup. We will have lanyards and card holders provided. Please stop by and pick yours up starting next week. You will not be allowed to be on the field until it is done.

I ask that everyone, please respect this request. Lanyards and badges must be worn always on fields.
